

Jobs for Veterans State Grants

About the Program

The Jobs for Veterans State Grants (JVSG) program provides individualized career and training-related services to veterans and eligible persons with significant barriers to employment.

From July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021 there were 1,302 participants in Ohio.

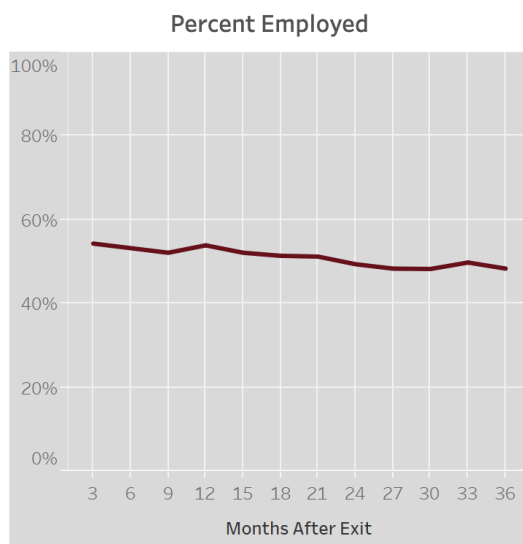
One-Year Outcomes

One year after their last JVSG service, 54% of people were employed in Ohio, and 55% were employed with the same employer from six months to one year after completion. Of those who were employed, median annual earnings were \$42,300. Workers were most commonly employed in the Administrative, Support, Waste Management, and Remediation Services, Health Care and Social Assistance, and Manufacturing industries.

During their exit period and in the following year, 6% of people who completed JVSG services in 2020/21 were enrolled in a public Ohio college.

Employment Over Time

The charts below display employment patterns across a 3-year time period. For those whose JVSG services ended in 2019/20 or 2020/21, employment in Ohio reached 54% 3 months after services and declined to a low of 48% 36 months after services. Median annual earnings rose from \$35,000 6 months after services to \$42,600 36 months after services.



In the three years after leaving JVSG, 48% to 54% of people were employed (Statewide, Overall).
