About the Program

Ohio Technical Centers (OTC) provide post-secondary career and technical education that prepares learners for certificates, industry-recognized certifications, and state licensures.

From July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021 there were 12,229 participants in Ohio.


One-Year Outcomes

One year after completing an OTC program, 80% of completers were employed in Ohio, and 62% were employed with the same employer from six months to one year after completion. Of those who were employed, median annual earnings were \$36,400. Workers were most commonly employed in the Health Care and Social Assistance, Manufacturing, and Public Administration industries.


During their exit period and in the following year, 12% of completers were enrolled in a public higher education institution in Ohio and 82% had earned a credential at an Ohio Technical Center.

Employment Over Time

The charts below display employment patterns across a 3 year time period. For those who completed an OTC program in 2019/20 or 2020/21, employment in Ohio reached 79% 12 months after completion and declined to a low of 74% 36 months after completion. Median annual earnings rose from \$28,500 3 months after completion to \$41,700 36 months after completion.



In the three years after leaving OTC, 74% to 79% of people were employed (Statewide, Overall).



In the three years after leaving OTC, employed individuals earned \$28,500 to \$41,700 per year (Statewide, Overall).
