Vocational Rehabilitation - Youth

About the Program

Vocational Rehabilitation services assist people with physical, mental and emotional disabilities find and retain meaningful work and personal independence. Services are available to eligible Ohioans aged 14 years and older.

From July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021 there were 14,828 participants in Ohio.


One-Year Outcomes

One year after completing Youth Vocational Rehabilitation services, 59% of people were employed in Ohio, and 59% were employed with the same employer from six months to one year after completing Youth Vocational Rehabilitation services. Of those who were employed, median annual earnings were \$14,000. Workers were most commonly employed in the Accommodation and Food Services, Health Care and Social Assistance, and Retail Trade industries.

During their exit period and in the following year, 7% of people who completed Vocational Rehabilitation Youth services in 2020/21 were enrolled in a public Ohio college.

Employment Over Time

The charts below display employment patterns across a 3 year time period. For those who completed Youth Vocational Rehabilitation services in 2019/20 or 2020/21, employment in Ohio hit a low of 53% 9 months after completion and reached a high of 59% 33 months after completion. Median annual earnings rose from \$11,800 3 months after completion to \$16,100 36 months after completion.



In the three years after leaving VR Youth, 53% to 59% of people were employed (Statewide, Overall).
